



What is your favourite flower?



EYFS and KS1 news



Year 1 have enjoyed their new topic in Geography this week. We have started to learn all about the UK (and its weather!). We identified the 4 countries of the UK and their capital cities using an atlas and then we labelled a map independently. We are also started finding out about fairy tales for our English writing.



Year 2 loved the amazing disco held by the PTA. Year 2 also had fun developing their writing skills in English. This half term, in English, Year 2 are finding out about keeping healthy – they have read a magazine article all about health and then they will write their own explanation article to show what they have learnt.

This week, we will focus on Year R

This week we have been reading 'Naughty Bus' - Naughty Bus has had lots of fun visiting children at home and causing chaos! We have also been learning about the differences between transport in the past and transport in the present. We created road signs to add to the 'Naughty Bus road' in our classroom and we have drawn maps of our school grounds. During our literacy lessons we have been writing super sentences linked to transport.




KS2 news

This week in DT, Year 3 have started to learn about pneumatic systems. They created their very own simple system using tubing, syringes and a balloon! In Maths, we used fraction discs to help us to understand the whole.



This week, Year 4 had their first swimming lesson, and it was a great success! The children loved it and had a great time. Year 4 have also been finding out about keeping safe while they are working and playing games on the internet

Finally, Year 6 started learning about the Maya this week and created a timeline for the Maya civilisation. In PSHE, they started their 'Healthy Me' topic and worked in groups to give advice in a range of scenarios.

Year 5 have had a wonderful return to school. They have started exploring mechanisms in D&T, with the aim of creating pop-up story books for Year 1. To continue the creative theme, Year 5 have been learning how to create stop-motion animation in their computing lessons. Year 5 are looking forward to sharing their projects at the end of the term. Finally, the children have been enjoying learning all about the Alps in Geography, where they have started by locating the Alps on a map.
