EYFS and KS1 news

This week, Reception have created their own maps of towns for Naughty Bus to visit. They added features to their maps, such as shops, car parks, playgrounds, swimming pools, a mosque, hospitals and a school. They drew roads and labelled their maps using great phonics knowledge, well done Reception for your hard

Year 1 have worked hard this week. We created journey sticks as part of our geography lesson, going into Forest School to find and attach items that represented the seasons. In Science, we have been using all of our knowledge about the different animal groups to categorise them by their features; we thought about how they were different or similar.

In Maths, Y3 have been learning about equivalent fractions and using fractions walls to help them to spot which fractions are equivalent. This week in History, we learnt about Boudicca and her army who tried to stop the Roman invasion. 

Just a reminder about World Book Day, which is this Friday – 8th March.

Ideas for the day -

Children are encouraged to come dressed as a favourite book character (optional)

If children don't want to dress up, school uniform is to be worn

Children to bring in their favourite book to discuss with their classmates (book named if possible)

Other ideas – book in a box (shoe box size to represent a favourite book)

Book review / design a new front cover / design an outfit for a character

Draw a favourite character and write about them

Write a summary of your favourite book

Be a reporter and ask family members / friends about their favourite stories

Write the next chapter of a story – 'What might happen next?' Design a poster advertising your favourite book

Design a 'Wanted' poster for the 'villain' in your story
