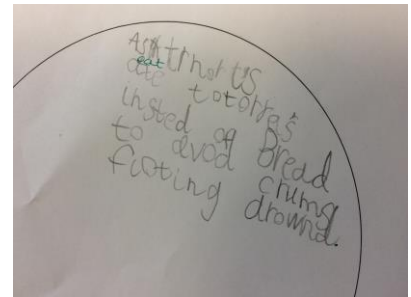
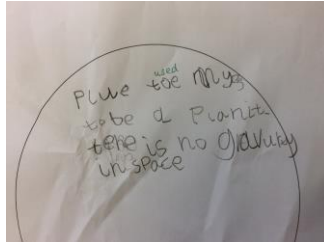

EYFS and KS1 news

This week YR have been learning about space. We read 'Whatever Next!' and then learnt lots of new facts about space. We wrote our facts onto planet shapes and decorated the planets.



Year 2 have made healthy wraps, which we really enjoyed, using a balance of carbohydrates, protein and vegetables – they tasted delicious! In English, we have been learning about poetry writing, focusing on a poem called 'Travel' which is about how our modes of transport have evolved over time. We have been thinking about what travel might look like in the future and have been designing our own futuristic vehicles.

We spent some time learning about the history of the church and then we had a challenge to find lots of examples of the symbolic representations of Jesus in the church. We were incredibly respectful and loved exploring this special place of worship!



KS2 news

This week in History, Year 3 have been learning about the power of the Roman army, including learning a range of army formations and their uses. The children even practised some of the formations outside. In DT, the children finished off decorating their pneumatic toys, making sure to add characterful details!

This week in Year 4, we have been making pavilions. We have learned how to build an open, aesthetically pleasing structure, which we have attempted to make from card. We will be decorating next week!

Finally, Year 6 – we have been publishing our news reports, concentrating on our best handwriting. We have also been learning lots about the Maya civilisation in History and comparing their homes to those of the Anglo-Saxons

This week, Year 5 spent time exploring the local area as part of their Geography topic. The children used their research to compare the local area to Innsbruck, in the Alpine region. They focused on how the land was being used for leisure in each area. The children created amazing brochures to show their knowledge of the physical and human characteristics of the region.

This week in Reception we have been learning about Holy Week. We used pebbles, sticks and leaves to create our own Holy Week images.

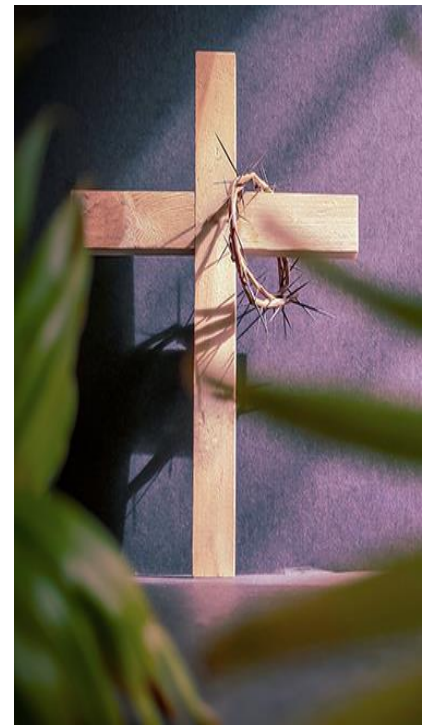
