EYFS and KS1 news

Year 1 have had another busy week – we have written our stories in English and then we tried really hard to write them neatly in our publishing books.

We thought about how we could start the ideas with time conjunctions like First, Next, After that and Finally. In maths we have been counting in 5s and discussing the patterns we could see.

Year 2 have worked very hard this week – we have planned and started to write our story based on 'Cinderelephant' – we focussed on interesting time conjunctions to open our sentences and higher level vocabulary choices to describe the characters.


