EYFS and KS1 news

Year R - We have been reading 'No Dinner!' by Jessica Souhami. This is a folk tale from the Indian Subcontinent and is set in a forest. We joined in retelling the story using familiar phrases. Later in the week, we created some artwork inspired by Henri Roussean, who imagined the jungles and forests and then painted the images he saw in his imagination. We used this technique to paint pictures of the forest in 'No Dinner!'. After talking to her mummy and daddy about our learning, Alice brought in some pictures of India and a beautiful Indian scarf. She told us all about the Taj Mahal, the Golden Temple and prayer flags.







Year 1. - We have been busy starting our new English topic, this week, which is centred around a poem about Toys. We have been discussing the poem and the new vocabulary. We have also been reading the poem aloud in small groups and acting it out. In Maths, we have been counting in different jumps and looking at fractions of shapes like a half and a quarter.

This week, we will focus on Year 2

In our History lessons, we have been learning about monarchs and William the Conqueror. We learnt that William the Conqueror built nearly 500 castles, while he was in power - so we created our own castles. We planned and designed our castles first. We then thought about which materials we would need to build our castles. Once we did that, we spent the whole afternoon creating our castles, which were inspired by William the Conqueror. In Year 4 this week, we have been learning all about the discovery and excavation of Sutton Hoo, an ancient Anglo Saxon Burial site. We learned about all the treasures that were discovered in the UK's biggest ever Anglo Saxon treasure discovery.

A well-deserved fun day of sports, computer quizzes and a movie on Friday helped them to celebrate their hard work!

On Friday 24th May, we will be holding a fundraising event for Christian Aid. Christian Aid is a charity that works to eradicate poverty by tackling its root causes. 26% of the world's population do not have access to safe drinking water, so to stand in solidarity with these people, whilst raising lots of money and having fun, we will be walking up to one mile carrying a bucket.

The walk will take place on the afternoon of Friday 24th May and all children should bring a bucket - any kind of bucket will do from a beach bucket to a mop bucket! If you don't have a bucket, just let your child's class teacher know as we have some spares.

Please make sure your bucket is named – you may want to bring a spare for a friend – make sure this is named too!

We won't fill our buckets with water as we don't want to waste this precious resource, but we will carry beanbags or small balls in our buckets. **Children do not need any special clothes or footwear** for the activity.
