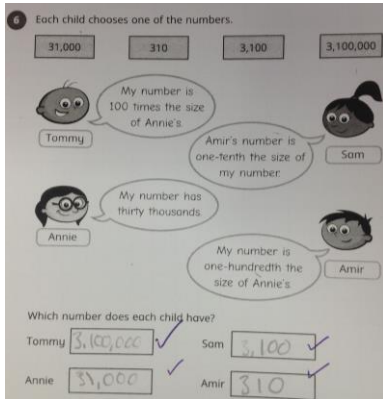

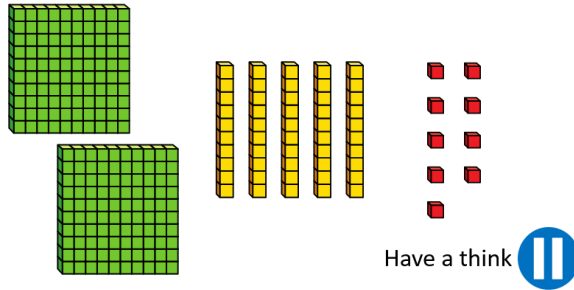

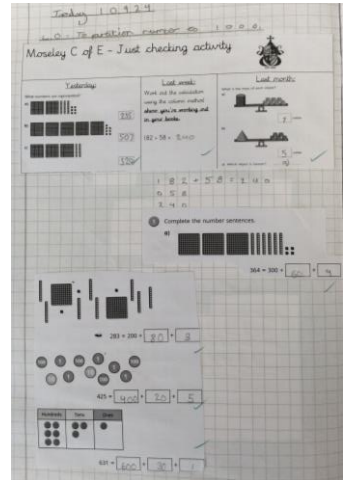
Year 4 News

This week, we have been learning all about place value in maths. We have been learning about numbers up to 1000. We have also been comparing and ordering numbers.

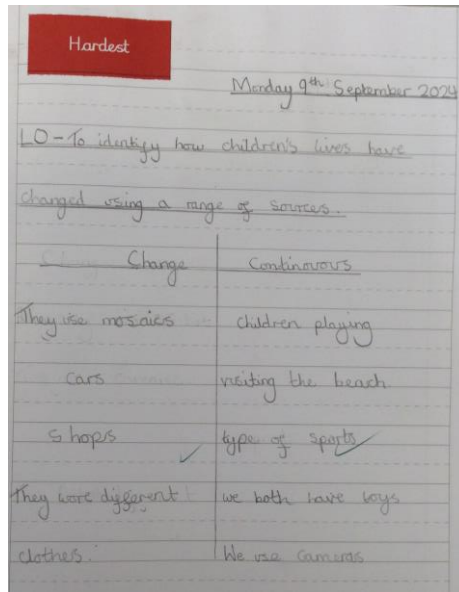


$$259 = 2 \text{ hundreds} + 5 \text{ tens} + 9 \text{ ones}$$

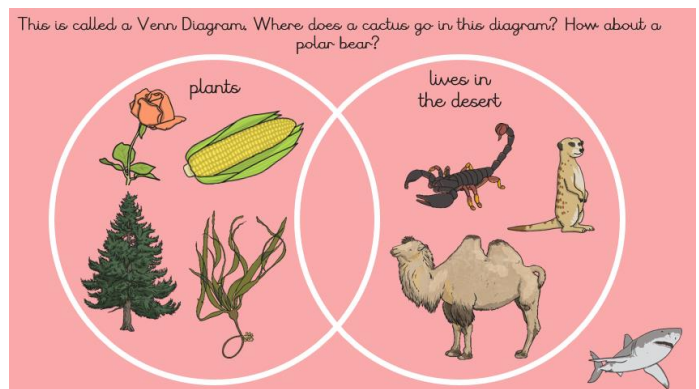

Year 3 News

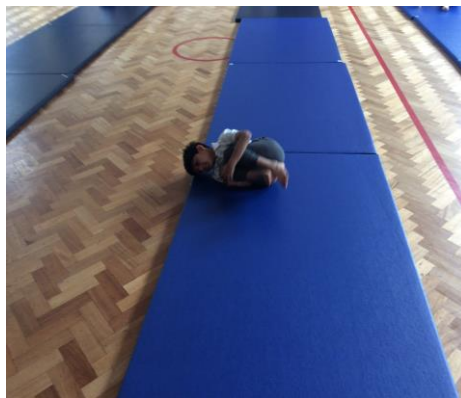
In Year 3, this week, they have started gymnastics and football in PE. In football, they have learnt how to pass the ball, using the inside of their foot. They worked in pairs and worked on their technique for a more accurate and consistent delivery.

In gymnastics, they were encouraged to think about different body parts and create different shapes, for example, creating a tucked sit position, straddle sit and making themselves as wide or as narrow as possible.

Year 3 have also started to learn French. This week, they have learnt how to greet themselves and others in French. "Je m'appelle Miss Islam. Comment t'appelle tu?"

In History, they are learning about the Stone, Bronze and Iron age. They have learnt what AD and BC stands for and can locate it on a timeline. They have also learnt that the prehistoric period began a million years ago.

In Science we are learning about the skeleton; so far, we have identified, 5 different bones and where they are located on the skeleton.

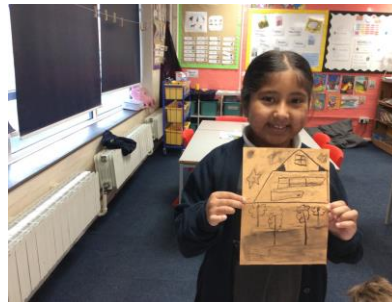
Maths

The children have created story maps to illustrate the narrative and have been practising writing sentences about the various characters, enhancing their understanding of story structure and character development.



In History, the children have been exploring the concept of how they make history. They have begun identifying the key features of a timeline, fostering an appreciation for the sequence of events and the passage of time.

In Art, we have engaged in mark-making activities, exploring the creation of different types of lines such as wavy, diagonal, crosshatch, and broken lines. Using a variety of mediums, including string, paper, and chalk, the children drew inspiration from the artwork of Bridget Riley, discovering how lines can be transformed into stunning artistic expressions.

During our RE learning this week, we began to think about our wonderful world. We talked about our favourite animals. Later in the day, we drew our animals and placed them around the globe.



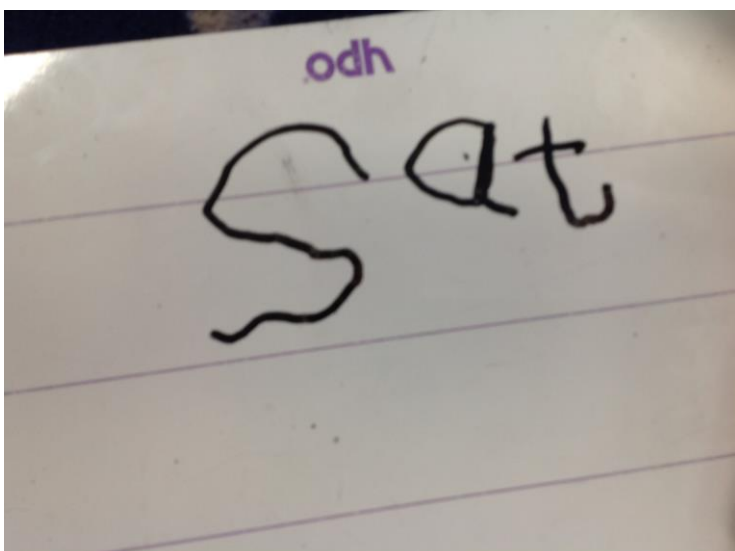
Marvellous Me!
